The Constitution of Barbados

THE ELECTORAL AND BOUNDARIES COMMISSION (REVIEW OF BOUNDARIES) ORDER, 2011

WHEREAS

- (a) the Electoral and Boundaries Commission in accordance with section 41D(1) of the *Constitution* reviewed the number and boundaries of the constituencies into which Barbados is divided and on the 7th September, 2011 submitted a report to the Minister, stating that, in the opinion of the Commission, no alteration is required to the existing number or boundaries of constituencies;
- (b) the House of Assembly on the day of ,
 2011 and the Senate on the day of ,
 2011, approved a draft of the following order designed to give effect to the recommendation contained in the report; and
- (c) it is expedient to give legal effect to that recommendation.

NOW THEREFORE the Governor-General in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 41D(5) of the *Constitution*, makes the following Order:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Electoral and Boundaries

 Commission (Review of Boundaries) Order, 2011.
- 2. There is no requirement for any alteration of the existing number or boundaries of constituencies into which Barbados is divided.
- 3. This Order shall come into force on the next dissolution of Parliament.
