## **SCHEDULE**

**ALL THAT** certain piece or parcel of land the property of Stephen Cave situate at Mount No. 1, Mount Stepney in the parish of Saint Peter in this Island containing by admeasurement 4315.8 square metres or thereabouts Abutting and Bounding on lands now or late of Nathaniel Springer and on other lands now or late of Stephen Cave deceased on three sides or however else the same may abut and bound as shown and delineated on a plan certified on the 27th day of May, 2004 by Harrell (Jackie) Gaskin, Land Surveyor and recorded in the Lands and Surveys Department on the 21st day of June, 2004 as Plan No. 645/2004.

## **ADDENDUM**

On the 3rd day of July, 2003 the Cabinet agreed to the acquisition of the parcel of land described in the Schedule to this Resolution situate at Mount No. 1, Mount Stepney in the parish of Saint Peter in this Island for the public purpose of constructing a Repeater Station for the Royal Barbados Police Force. Such a Station is expected to improve the telecommunications system particularly in the areas of St. Lucy, St. Andrew, St. Joseph, St. John and St. Philip and allow members of the Police Force working in those areas to communicate more effectively with their Stations and Operations Control.

The approval of Parliament is now sought for the compulsory acquisition of the parcel of land more particularly described in the Schedule hereto in order that the public purpose set out in the Resolution may be effected and that the Crown may acquire an indefeasible title to the said parcel of land.
