MARINE TRANSPORT (EMISSIONS CONTROL) BILL, 2024

- (a) the implementation of the 1997 Protocol to the International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships (MARPOL) 1973, as modified by the Protocol of 1978 relating thereto and by the Protocol of 1997;
- (b) the implementation of Article 212 of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, 1982;
- (c) the implementation of the Technical Code on Control of Emission of Nitrogen Oxides from Marine Diesel Engines adopted by the International Maritime Organization;
- (d) the control of emissions from ships that exceed 150 gross tons;
- (e) the promotion of energy efficiency in shipping;
- (f) and related matters;

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE VESTING OF LAND AT PILGRIM PLACE, CHRIST CHURCH IN THE NATIONAL HOUSING CORPORATION

ALL THAT land situate at Pilgrim Place in the parish of Christ Church in this Island containing by admeasurement 8150.9 square metres of land (inclusive of 862.0 square metres in right of way) Abutting and Bounding on lands now or formerly of Joseph Brathwaite (Lot 1) on lands now or late of Reuven Best on lands now or formerly of Jonathan Taylor on lands now or late of Vincent Best on lands now or formerly of Clyde Riley on lands now or late of Diven Chapman *et al* on lands now or formerly of Lewin Green on lands now or late of Isalene Roach on a right of way 4.88 metres wide on lands now or late of Favourita Blanchard (Lot 2B) on lands now or formerly of Isalene Roach (Lot 2A) on lands now or late of Meta Edgehill and on a public road called Highway #7 leading to Grantley Adams International Airport in one direction and to Pilgrim Place 'A' in the other direction as shown and delineated on a plan certified on the 18th day of June, 2014 by Samuel N.
